

## RESERVED EASEMENTS

- A trail easement twenty-five (25) feet in width for a trail for use by the public to gain access to and from public land to the north and south. The easement generally parallels the coastline.
- A road easement sixty (60) feet in width for a road for use by the public to gain access to and from the Point Lay Dew Station, Point Lay, and the Pt. Lay water supply.
- EIN 5 A trail easement fifty (50) feet in width on a trail system for use by the public to gain access to and from public land. Beginning at Point Lay and running southerly to the Epizetka River, in Section 30 of T. 3 N., R. 44 W., U.M.
- EIN 5a A trail easement fifty (50) feet in width on a trail system for use by the public to gain access to and from public land. The segment begins at Point Lay and runs southerly to the Epizetka River. In Section 30 of T. 3 N., R. 44 W., U.M., the trail system branches into EIN 5b and 5c.
- EIN 5b A trail easement fifty (50) feet in width on a trail system for use by the public to gain access to and from public land. This segment branches from EIN 5a in Section 30 of T. 3 N., R. 44 W., U.M. and follows the Epizetka River.

## EIN 5c

Segment 5c branches from EIN 5 in Section 30 of T. 3 N., R. 44 W., U.M. and follows the right bank (looking downstream) of the Kukpowruk River northwest to its mouth and south to public land.

## EIN 9

A site easement for camping, vehicle use and staging, located on the right bank (looking downstream) of the Kukpowruk River in Section 21, T. 3 N., R. 45W., U.M. The easement extends twenty-five (25) feet into the water. The portion of the easement on the bed of the river is in addition to the one (1) acre on the land.
